

A TERRITORIAL APPROACH TO THE SDG'S OECD SECOND MISSION TO PARANA, BRAZIL 2 DECEMBER 2020 (virtual mission)

PROGRAMME

The State of Parana, Brazil, sees the SDGs as a powerful tool to reduce territorial disparities and inequalities. The SDGs are also a robust instrument to promote exchange of good practices among municipalities and to enhance innovation to the state and municipal levels based on an integrated approach. Parana is working to mainstream the SDGs in budgeting and to strengthen financial support to municipalities in advancing implementation of the SDGs. Parana is working to develop consistent tools and local indicators. The State is also promoting collaboration amongst different levels of government, including the justice and audit courts, the private sector, academia and civil society to leverage efforts on the implementation of the SDGs.

The OECD team will complete its second mission to Parana (virtual) on 2 December 2020. The main goal is to share OECD preliminary assessment and recommendations with key local stakeholders for a technical discussion to collect final comments and to define - in a participatory manner - the action plan for the implementation of the SDGs in the State.
